Why hold a Green May Fair at Blewbury School?

Sustainable Blewbury (SB) is concerned with climate and environmental change against the background of rising levels of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases. We are seeking ways of avoiding our dependency on fossil fuels and reducing our carbon footprint.

In addition to promoting biodiversity, we have activities centering on saving energy and promoting renewables, reducing car and transport miles, encouraging local food sourcing and growing as well as reducing, reusing and recycling (RRR) our possessions.

Adapting to greener lifestyles has many benefits and can be good fun. This Green May Fair being organized jointly with Blewbury School is a celebration of the many SB activities and of discovering new ways for all of us young and old to discover and rediscover sustainable ways of living.

Blewbury Endowed C of E Primary School is really pleased to be able to work alongside Sustainable Blewbury to support the May Fair. The aims and values of the group are complementary to many of our school aims around educating our pupils to understand that all of their actions and reactions have an effect on others. This can be extended to acknowledging that we need to both look after our environment to sustain its ecological facets for the future as well as ensuring that we work to develop habits e.g. recycling, reusing which ensure that our personal carbon footprint is minimised.

At school we have an Eco Council and we are working towards gaining the Green Hub School Award. This hopefully will contribute towards gaining Eco-Schools Green Flag status. The school will contribute towards the village Eco Centre and Sustainable Blewbury are the community element of school initiatives. Hence the two organisations are mutually supportive.

We also hope to have solar panels installed during the summer holidays through our participation in the Low Carbon Schools' Solar Scheme.
